

ounded in 1913, the Rotary Club of Sacramento is one of the oldest service groups in the Sacramento region which, throughout its history, has maintained an impressive commitment to community service. The Rotary Club of Sacramento Foundation, organized by Rotary members in 1971, is a California nonprofit public benefit corporation and qualifies as a charitable entity under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3).

OUR MISSION

Our Mission is to provide leadership, perpetual funding and resources necessary to support the diverse humanitarian efforts of the Rotary Club of Sacramento in local and world communities.

OUR VISION

The Foundation's Vision is to provide the means to support extraordinary accomplishments through our stewardship of a self-sustaining fund. Our recognition as a premiere organization includes our focus on supporting youth.



Legacy Circle

The Rotary Club of Sacramento Foundation has set up the Legacy Circle to recognize those Rotarians who are leaving a legacy of support to the ideals of the Rotary Club of Sacramento by helping our community.

Membership in the Circle is attained by donating a beguest from estate plans such as a contribution from wills, trusts, life insurance, charitable gift annuities or other retirement plans, evidenced by appropriate documentation.

The "Legacy Circle" name is derived from the concept that Rotarians earn their livelihood from this community, take care of their families, and eventually accumulate assets beyond their daily needs. Then, those assets go full circle as Rotarians put some portion of their net worth back into the community through planned giving to our Rotary Club of Sacramento Foundation.

otary Scholarships totaling **\$17,648** were awarded during the 2010-2011 School year. Awards went to six graduating seniors from McClatchy, Sacramento and Rio Americano High Schools who demonstrated superior scholastic aptitude, vocational skills, leadership, community involvement and financial need. These awards were funded from the five Scholarship Funds listed above.

College scholarships are awarded to graduating seniors for full-time undergraduate enrollment at an accredited four-year college (although awards may be deferred for a two-year period while a student attends community college). Fields of study that will benefit the future of the community and foster the principles of Rotary are encouraged. Scholarship applicants may not be the children of Rotarians.

Bids for Kids 2011 ★ \$139,000 raised!

\ur signature event since 1984, the annual Bids for Kids Dinner and $\mathcal J$ Auction has raised over \$3 million for deserving children's organizations.

This year's event was a tremendous success, raising \$139,000 for the new Powerhouse Science Center located along the Sacramento River and scheduled to open in 2013. It will be the future home of the 60-yearold Discovery Museum Science & Space Center where Bids for Kids took place under the stars in a beautifully decorated tent powered by a hydrogen fuel cell.

Helping to make it an outstanding year were major sponsors, a substantial matching grant of \$100,000 from the Morgan Family Foundation and Social Venture Partners of Sacramento, and those who donated directly rather than through the Rotary Foundation. An additional \$40,450 was raised through Rotary members' participation in a special telethon for the Discovery Museum Science & Space Center.

World Community Service

The World Community Service Committee (WCSC) oversees funding for international projects identified by members of the Rotary Club of Sacramento.

There is a preference to fund projects that support the health and care of children, including community sanitation, water needs, education, community development and food production.

Funds can potentially be augmented by matching funds from Rotary District 5180 and Rotary International.

Sacramento to Ethiopia: Clean Water Project



The Rotary Club of Sacramento partnered with Rotarian Seifu Ibssa to build a water well in the village of Acheber, Ethiopia.

The well provides clean water to over 100 school children who attend classes at a nearby school and to more than 250 villagers.

With clean water, the children are now being taught basic hygiene practices, and their clean well water now solves many health issues associated with water-borne diseases that have plaqued the community. The project was completed in three months.

The Youth Incentive Program (YIP) matches at-risk children with Rotary Club mentors who help them develop into productive and confident young adults. Mentors give freely of their time in supporting students to establish and meet academic, athletic, social and self-esteem goals.


Upon graduation from high school and successful completion of the YIP program, each student is eligible to receive a major scholarship toward continuing their education.

This year, the Foundation awarded \$4,487 in YIP scholarships.

Since the inception of the YIP Program, the Foundation has awarded \$103,226 in YIP Scholarships.
